Donation and Program Portfolio



### Puma Project (*Puma concolor*)

The Puma Project began in 2019, when at Estancia Cerro Guido we decided to stop hunting and start understanding the puma. Through direct sightings, camera traps, and satellite monitoring, we have learned to understand its behavior and make decisions that now make coexistence between wildlife and livestock possible.



### Huemul Project (*Hippocamelus bisulcus*)

The huemul, an endangered Chilean deer species that inhabits Torres del Paine, will be monitored through the use of camera traps. This approach aims to ensure its conservation by identifying its habits and movement areas within the Estancia Complejo Torres del Paine.



### Guanaco Project (*Lama guanicoe*)

The Guanaco Project aims to study the guanaco population in Torres del Paine, its interaction with domestic fauna, migration patterns, and the environmental and human factors that affect it. This knowledge will help develop more effective management strategies for this emblematic species, which is often associated with conflicts due to its alleged overpopulation and competition with livestock.



### Condor Project (*Vultur gryphus*)

The Condor is a species classified as vulnerable in Chile. The purpose of this project is to support all research and conservation efforts for this majestic bird. In the conservation area where we work, we have identified not only places where Condors perch and rest, but also nesting sites.



### Protective Dogs

The use of guardian dogs, such as the Great Pyrenees and the Maremma Sheepdog, has proven to be one of the most effective tools for protecting livestock without harming predators. Raised from puppies alongside the sheep, they recognize them as part of their pack and defend them with instinct and loyalty. This project aims to establish a breeding program that strengthens our coexistence model and allows us to share it with other ranches, providing support and guidance to replicate this respectful way of living in harmony between livestock and wildlife.



### Georeferencing and Data

To improve livestock management decisions, it is essential to understand the territory and identify the most sensitive areas. In cooperation with the livestock area, a heat map is being developed to enable evidence-based grazing rotations and lay the foundation for a coexistence model that can be applied in other regions.



### Cultural Heritage

The rescue and appreciation of the culture that shaped the Patagonian territory is part of the foundation's purpose. To this end, continuous historical research is carried out, which is currently materializing in the publication of two books about Cerro Guido.



### Territorial Planning

At Cerro Guido Foundation, we understand the territory as a dynamic space where different actors interact — one that we believe can achieve sustainable coexistence in the long term. This is why it is so important to plan these spaces with a strategic and regenerative vision.



### Local Communities

At Cerro Guido, we are convinced of the importance of involving local communities in conservation and science. For this reason, we will not only continue presenting the foundation's work in schools, but also offer the opportunity for these communities to experience the project firsthand and free of charge during the low season.



### Students and Researchers

In the winter of 2025, the Foundation's House for Research and Outreach was restored and inaugurated. This space will host researchers and students who wish to learn in the field and share knowledge. It will also serve as a meeting point for talks and workshops, strengthening the connection between science, the community, and conservation in one of the wildest places on the planet.



### Volunteering Opportunities

The Foundation's area of operation offers countless opportunities for conservation work, studies, monitoring, fieldwork, and more. This project aims to fund the stay of volunteer staff who assist with the Foundation's various activities.
